Handmade wooden box for metal dies with 43 dies and blades. Made and used by Melvin Carner, who worked on windows in Napa. The box is in very poor condition and needs to be conserved to maintain the integrity of the object.

This beautiful mirror is circa 1870. It was placed over the fireplace mantel in the Victorian residence of John Finnell from around 1870-to the early 1930s. The house was located on land that was originally part of the Rancho Caymus. The mirror is in need of some major repairs to the frame.

Chiles Cowhide Trunk

This trunk was brought across the plains by Margaret Jane Garnhart Chiles in 1854. It was her first trip across the plains and Colonel J.B. Chiles's fourth. The Chiles family bought land in the area of Napa County now known as Chiles Valley and was one of the important founding families in the region. The trunk is in need of a good cleaning to remove some of the water damage and travel stains. It also needs some restoration on the leather handles.
