About Sunday Soup

The goal is to fund small creative projects through community meals. The basic formula is that a group of people comes together to share a meal and that meal is sold for an affordable price. The income from that meal is given as a grant to support a creative project.

Requests for Proposals

To be considered as a small grant recipient, please complete the application (download here) and submit to Meagan@NapaValleyMuseum.org. Applications are due October 12, 2015. If your proposal is a finalist, we will invite you to be a guest at the dinner to share more details about your project, share ideas and generally connect with you. Finalists must attend dinner to be eligible. *We anticipate the grant money to total approximately \$200.*

What kind of projects are eligible?

Any creative project in the arts (art, music, writing, literature, dance, theater, etc.) that you're passionate about. The only other requirement is that it in some way impacts the Napa Valley. This means that wherever else it occurs, grows, or is shared; it must also be shared in Napa Valley. Individuals and organizations may apply. Projects must be completed within one year.

We are especially interested in projects that are accessible to a wide community audience, such as events that are free or low-cost, projects that impact an underserved community, or contribute to the advancement of the arts in Napa Valley.

Thank you for submitting to Napa Valley Museum's Sunday Soup. To be considered as a small grant recipient, please complete the application and submit to Meagan@NapaValleyMuseum.org. Applications are due October 12, 2015. Applications that exceed the word count will not be considered.

1. Describe your project (max. 250 words)
2. How will you use the money? (Generally state what the funds will be used for: honorarium, materials, studio rent, publicity, etc.): (max. 100 words)
3. Why is this project important? How does this project benefit the community? (max. 200 words)
4. What is the schedule for your project and how will you share updates with us as the project progresses? (max. 200 words)
5. Tell us a little about yourself. (A little about yourself or your group and what led you to your current creative goals. This may include a previous project of yours, ways it both succeeded and failed (this can be entirely unrelated to your proposal) approx. (max. 200 words)
